This half term we will apply our mathematical knowledge to statistics and position and direction by:

- Making, drawing and interpreting tally charts, block diagrams, tables and pictograms.
- Describing position, movement and turns.
- Exploring shape patterns with turns.

We will also continue to revisit concepts taught throughout the year to consolidate our learning.



This half term, we will be reading 'Giraffes Can't Dance' by Giles Andreae. We will use this inspire our own animal adventure stories.

We will also consolidate our knowledge on how to use different punctuation and use a variety of conjunctions to join our ideas.

We will explore poetry and limericks. We will learn how to identify the rhyming patterns and create our own poems with rhymes.



There are two types of reading book that your child will bring home:

A reading practice book. This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.

A sharing book. Your child will not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

<u>Accelerated Reader</u>

We are continuing to encourage the children to read their chosen book throughout the week in school and at home. In school, children will then complete a quiz on their chosen book to assess their understanding.

Please remember to bring in this book everyday as there will be opportunities for you to practise reading by yourself and with an adult in preparation for the quiz.





We are looking forward to starting our new Creative topic, All Things Bright and Beautiful.

We will have lots of exciting creative work to complete this half term, including learning about plants, animals and how to sew!



In this topic, we will be become scientists to learn about the world around us. We will:

- Know the names of animals to their offspring.
- Understand what the basic needs of animals and humans survival are.
- Identify what plants needs for growth.
- Understand that plants produce seeds in order to reproduce and generate new plants.
- Recognise the elements of a food chain.

We will also learn to sew and join fabrics together using a running stitch.

<u> PSHE - Me in the World</u>

In PSHE, we will discuss the positive and negatives of the local area.

We will also understand how money can be used and how to keep it safe.

RE - Showing Kindness and Goodness

In RE, We will listen ad respond to stories highlighting the moral and values of beliers in practice.

PE - Invasion games and Yoga

In yoga, we will practise balances. We will also consider the physical and mental benefits of exercise.

Through our game lessons, we will learn some attacking and defending technique such as dodging and marking.



Please aim to complete at least 2 pieces of homework each half term.

We love to see your homework and celebrate your hard work with the class.
