- Understanding the narrative 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes






Maths

In their maths lessons this term, children will be:

- Using a formal written method to multiply a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number
- Dividing a 2-digit number by a 1-digit number with and without remainders
- Measuring in metres and centimetres
- Calculating perimeter



Reading at home - Accelerated Reader

In Year 3, children begin to use the Accelerated Reader Programme and they are encouraged to read their chosen book throughout the week. The children will then complete a quiz on their chosen book to assess their understanding. Children also pick a library book of their choice, which can be above their reading level, this can be read to them at home and they do not have to complete a quiz.

Spelling

History and Science

In science we are going to be finding out about the forces that are used to make things move, including magnetic forces. Through completing a range of investigations we will be describing different forces in action (pulling and pushing) and whether the force requires direct contact between objects or whether the force can act at distance (magnetic force). We will also be comparing how an object moves over surfaces made from different materials, making predictions and measuring the distance travelled.

In history we will be continuing our knowledge of prehistory by looking at the Bronze and Iron Age in detail. This will include researching general life, artefacts and settlements including hillforts. We will be designing our own Iron Age shield and creating a menu for a typical meal.

Religious Education

Compare and contrast symbols of worship in the Christian, Islamic and Sikh religions.

Recognise different risks in a variety of situations and decide how to behave responsibly.
